Challenges

- Societal Challenges (Climate Change, Peak Oil, Competitiveness, Sustainability ...)
- Linking Transport Policy on different levels with other Policy (Research etc.)
- Decision-making under deep uncertainty
- Forecasts on what will happen in 40 years are very likely to be wrong







Foresight processes

- Foresight is a conceptual framework for a number of forwardlooking approaches of informed decision-making that include long-term considerations (Miles 2008).
- Answer to a lack of governance strategies dealing with complex and unpredictable transformation patterns.
- They focus on the increasing need of both economy and policy for **generating anticipatory strategies** and future scenarios in the present for the present.

- Mutual learning and strategic dialogue
- Reaching consensus
- Linking to wider socio-economic issues
- Coordinated/coherent action








Two basic elements of Foresight

Exploratory approach:












Normative approach:










Three Facets of Foresight
